

### A Message from Fr. Matt ...


Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ! What a great feast. Are you excited? I hope so. This is a great day to be Catholic. This is the day that we celebrate that we believe what Jesus says in the Bible and people of other Christian denominations don't. Does that sound mean? Sorry, but it is true. Fundamentalists, and there are many good and holy fundamentalists, will tell you that everything in the Bible is literal and true, except when Jesus says that the bread is His Body. Jesus is just being symbolic or allegorical there, they will say. But we believe that what Jesus says is what He says it is because He said it! It is a great day to be Catholic!

It's a great day to be Catholic not just because we are right, as fun as it is to be right. It's a great day to be Catholic because in just a few moments, you and I are going to receive and put into our bodies, the King and Savior of the World! The Very Flesh that turned water into wine, multiplied the loaves and fishes, raised Lazarus from the dead, opened the eyes of the blind, carried the Cross, suffered death and then defeated it and ascended to Heaven, that Flesh will be in your hands and mouth and bellies. That Very Flesh! Think about all of the worries and fears you have and then think about them again, believing that

this Very Flesh, that did all of these things, will be with you, inside you. Nothing is too much for this Flesh. It is a great day to be Catholic!

So here is a question for you; is it just a great day to be Catholic here at church? When you go out into the parking lot, will you remember who is inside you? Will you take Him with you to breakfast today? Will you take Him to work? Or are we just leaving Jesus at the door? If it really is a great day to be Catholic, if this really is what Jesus says it is, if Jesus is really inside of




us, shouldn't everyone we meet know it? Feel it?


#### **FAITH**

Reference: Walk By Faith - 2 Corinthians 5:1-10

1 For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven. 2 For in this tent we groan, longing to be further clothed with our heavenly habitation 3 if indeed, when we have taken it off, we shall not be found naked. 4 For while we are in this tent we groan and are weighed down, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. 5 Now the one who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a first installment. 6 So we are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, **7** for we walk by faith, not by sight. **8** Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. **9** Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. **10** For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

#### **CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES LAW**

Mandated reporters, having reasonable cause to believe that a child has been subjected to child abuse, or acts of child abuse, shall report

- immediately to the following agencies:
