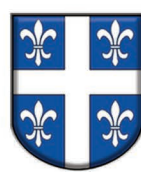

## A Message from Fr. Matt ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Father's Day to all of our Dads! Today is the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. In this feast, we celebrate the central tenant of our faith. That God is three persons, Father and Son and Holy Spirit, in one God. Some of you might remember a homily on this Feast Day a few years ago in which was mentioned old Palmolive commercials. I mean the ones with Madge, where she says, "You're soaking in it!" (I don't regret saying that!) I believe that is true. We live in the midst of the Trinity. I was thinking about that earlier as I looked at the Readings. What struck me this year is this line from our Second Reading today from the Letter to the Romans: "God's love has been poured into our hearts..."

### **Love poured into our hearts.**

While that old "you're soaking in it" line is true, maybe it's not enough. Maybe it is too exterior. It is true that we dwell in the Trinity, but it is also true that the Trinity dwells in us! Now maybe you are saying hold on there, Padre, that line doesn't say the Trinity is poured into our hearts. It says "God's love". You are right. But I would propose to you that love is the best definition of the Trinity.

One of the coolest words used to describe the nature of the Trinity is Kenotic. This means a total emptying of the self into the other, while simultaneously being filled by the other who pours everything out into you. It is a good way to describe the relationship between the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Kenotic is also a good way to describe love. Love as we have said in the past weeks, means to put the good of the other before your own good. It means being willing to suffer, to give everything for the good of the other. This is Kenosis. This is Love. This is the Trinity. This is what has been poured into our hearts!

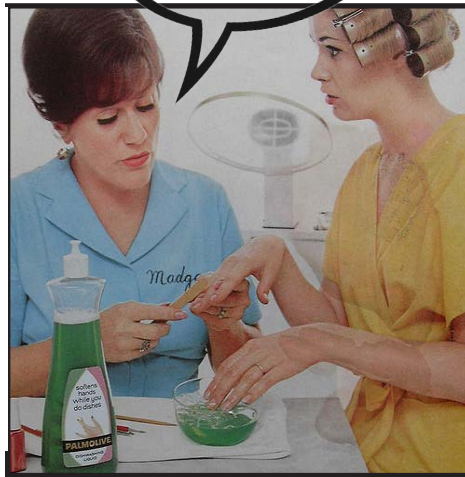
How does that make you feel? Warm and fuzzy? Maybe a little. It is a nice thing to think about. But how about this - does it make you feel challenged? I hope so. Does it challenge you to know that this is what God has put in your heart? This is who you are most truly, a person made to love. With this understanding, the challenge we should be feeling is, are we living this way? Are we a reflection of the Holy Trinity to others? We should be.

Today as we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity, let's challenge ourselves to be a true reflection of not just what is all around us, but what has been poured into our hearts. God loves Democrats and Republicans. God loves Muslims. God loves atheists. God loves people of every skin tone and complexion. God loves gay people and straight people. God loves people who are unsure of their gender. God loves the poor, the rich, and the in between. God loves the most horrible sinner as much as God loves the holiest saint. God loves everyone He created. On Trinity Sunday, our call is to mirror God's love, to reflect it back into our little part of this big world. Do you feel challenged? I hope you do. I sure do.

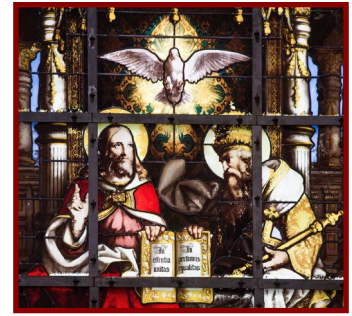
Show the Trinity to your world. Love everybody.

Trinity Sunday celebrates the Church's recognition of the Trinity as the three "persons" of the one God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is always the First Sunday after Pentecost.

During Mass, pay close attention to who we say that Jesus is as we proclaim the Gloria ("Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father") and profess the Creed ("I believe in Jesus Christ, the only Son of God ... God from God, Light from Light, True God from True God"). Listen for the word "consubstantial," which means "of the same substance." You'll say it in the Nicene Creed to describe Jesus Christ as "consubstantial with the Father."

Interesting fact: Trinity Sunday is a response to the Arian Heresy of the 4th century, which denied the divinity of Jesus Christ and instead proposed that he was an inferior god (higher than mankind, but lower than God the Father) and not the Son of God.

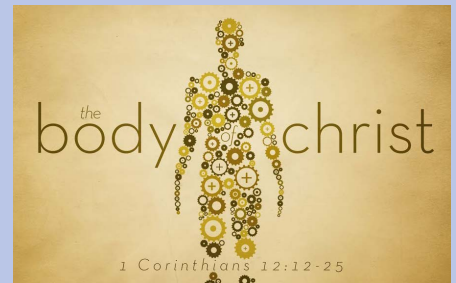
## Catholic Identity Program

This program highlights a variety of virtues and values  
through short lessons, prayers, Scripture references, and more.

This week's Virtue is:

**EMPATHY**

Empathy means  
understanding the feelings,  
thoughts and experiences  
of another person.



Reference: **1 Corinthians 12:12-26 - One Body, Many Parts**

**12** As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. **13** For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. **14** Now the body is not a single part, but many. **15** If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. **16** Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. **17** If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? **18** But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. **19** If they were all one part, where would the body be? **20** But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. **21** The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you," nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." **22** Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary, **23** and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, **24** whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, **25** so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. **26** If [one] part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.
